## THE NEED

All the streets were blocked; Felecha needed to get home to her children. When she arrived it was dark and quiet. "I thought maybe it was a dream," said Felecha about the devastation around her.

But it wasn't a dream. A tornado had just destroyed her home and she needed help fast. She needed a safe place for her children to sleep, clothes and meals. "Every time I just couldn't bear it, someone was there to help me. I am so grateful to live in a community that cares," Felecha said.



## THE ACTION

At first, the response had to be immediate and United Way partner agencies were on the scene within minutes of the tornados that wiped out neighborhoods and damaged homes and buildings. Food, clothing and shelter needs were taken care of as quickly as possible.

As time went on, the response needed to be long-term, because when you lose everything it can't all be replaced overnight. United Way partner agencies continue to assist those impacted by the tornados with stress counseling, replacing legal documents, rebuilding lives and so much more.

Triangle residents donated time and money to United Way partner agencies to help rebuild their devastated community. Of all the things the tornados taught us – it emphasized what it truly means to LIVE UNITED.
