- Last year, United Way of the Greater Triangle invested \$1,759,944 to strengthen the Financial Stability of individuals in the Triangle.
- 1,037 children received health (hearing, vision, and speech) and developmental screening
- 3,795 seniors received a hot nutritious meal on a daily basis
- Nearly 11,000,000 pounds of food was distributed
- Last year, United Way of the Greater Triangle invested \$2,768,491 to help both children and youth in the Triangle.
- 2,139 youth participated in one-on-one mentoring
- While over 15,000 participated in leadership and or character development programs
- Last year, there were at least 1,929 homeless men, women and children living on the streets and in homeless shelters
- Currently, 43% of homeless people have moved into permanent housing
- 108,566 shelter nights were provided for those who were homeless including those affected by disasters
- About 1 in 8 people living in the Triangle under age 65 do not have health insurance
- Yet, nearly 6,800 individuals in crisis had access to direct medical care
- United Way of Greater Triangle invested \$1,221,557 to help improve the health of the Triangle citizens
- In 2008, nearly 95,000 units of blood was collected
- 1 in 4 women will be victims of domestic violence
- 36,483 individuals received domestic violence education, prevention and/or management services
