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## PATHWAYS TO PROGRESS: THE TWO-GENERATIONAL MODEL

Break the intergenerational cycle of disconnection by:

- Providing parenting education and support to adolescent parents in an effort to decrease the likelihood that the second generation will become disconnected youth.
- Providing workforce development services and college/career preparation to increase likelihood of sustaining wages as an adult
- Promoting educational achievement and post-secondary educational opportunities in conjunction with school system staff and local community college.
- Developing workforce connections throughout the community to provide career exposure and experience
- Facilitating leadership development opportunities through volunteer and community activities, peer mentoring, and peer leadership.
