PATHWAYS TO PROGRESS: THE TWO-GENERATIONAL MODEL

- Increases children's school readiness
- Strengthens parent-child relationships through in-home interventions
- Increases children's developmental gains, enhances parent confidence and skills, and increases parental engagement in their children's learning
- Increases protective factors for children that reduce and buffer the negative impacts of toxic stress
- Enhances childcare providers' skills in teaching children problem-solving and other areas of social emotional development needed for school success
- Contributes to family economic stability by offering assistance to find stable child care and provides financial support to pay for high quality child care
- Creates a smooth transition to kindergarten by building relationships among children, parents and the school
- Supports positive behavior and academic gains in K-3rd grade
- Supports ready children and families, ready schools, and ready communities
