- Brings needed services into the EDCI Zone, so a lack of transportation is no longer a barrier to participation.
- Offers evidence-based, home-visiting services that improve home environments and parent-child relationships.
- Builds community support networks made up of families, friends, and neighbors.
- Prepares children, parents, and caregivers for school, making sure they are ready to learn, empowered, and informed.
