PATHWAYS TO PROGRESS: THE TWO-GENERATIONAL MODEL

- Identify food insecure families who repeatedly visit the food pantry and move them into a network of services
- Assign new patients to a physician and work with counselors, garden and wellness coordinator, pharmacy coordinator and specialty services coordinator to ensure medical needs are addressed
- Educate families on the importance of quality early care and education; connect them to a network of collective early childhood and school-aged services
- Connect women with career specialists for job training: resumes, cover letters, career coaching and professional attire. Plus job acquisition and retention programs and mock interviews at corporate offices.
