- Teach the skills and provide the support needed for these young parents to access job training opportunities and skill development.
- Access to Child Care Vouchers/ Scholarships
- Wrap-Around Services: stable and safe housing, steady employment
- Flexible, individualized plans that engage the whole family
- Develop strong and positive foundations, improve parenting skills, and establish economic stability
- Help young parents build the economic security they need to secure the well-being of their family
- Skill Building Workshops for both parents and children
