

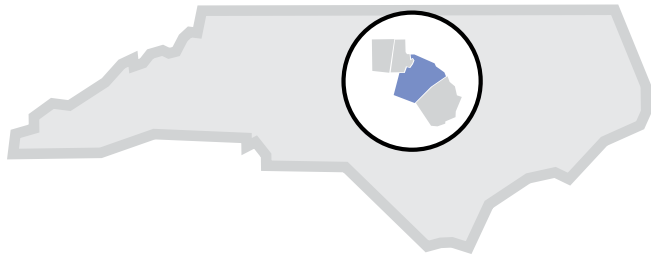

Wake County is now the largest NC county by population and has 3 of the top 10 fastest-growing municipalities.

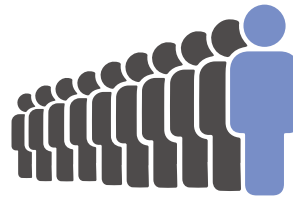


Average Raleigh rent is **\$1,644/mo.**

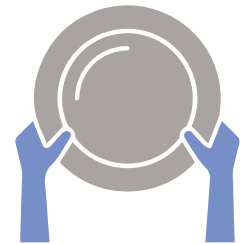

* The US Government defines the poverty line as income of \$27,750 or less for a family of 4. "Low-Income" is anything less than 200% of the poverty line.

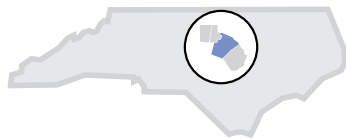
**A food desert is a low-income tract where a substantial number of residents do not have easy access to a supermarket or large grocery store.
