JOHN'S STORY: John has been the sole caretaker for his wife Marion since she received her dementia diagnosis five years ago. Marion wants to age in the comfort of her home but to do that, they needed one that was both handicap accessible and affordable.

Thankfully they were introduced to Crescent Magnolia, a community built by Habitat for Humanity of Orange County, NC to improve affordable home ownership for residents 55 years and older. After applying, they waited 18 more months and completed 275+ volunteer hours before finally moving into their new home. "My wife and I are the end result of why people should care about Habitat," John said. "We can live here the rest of our lives and not have to worry about getting displaced."
